About the Club

The Cambridge Enterprise & Technology Club provides a networking forum for business people, academics, technologists and service providers, together with a unique opportunity to learn about cutting edge technologies. The Club was founded as part of a Department of Trade & Industry initiative in the late 1980's to improve business skills.

The Club's meetings usually take the form of evening seminars, preceded by a buffet. A highlight of the Club's year is the annual Garden Party, which is held in the beautiful surroundings of Jesus College. Although the Club has a formal structure and programme of events, we strive for an informal atmosphere that allows members and guests to meet and talk with one another.

We hold monthly meetings on a range of topics, with an emphasis on subjects relevant to local businesses. There is a focus on new technologies and their applications. Many of our members have experience in companies that have grown rapidly by developing new products and by expanding into new markets, so there is plenty of knowledge to share. We usually invite at least two expert speakers to make presentations at each seminar and a notable feature of the Club is the ensuing Question & Answer session. As a result there is ample opportunity for discussion and members are able to learn from each other's experiences as well as from the experts.

The Club is a not-for-profit organisation, with no political affiliation. We are governed by a written constitution and managed by an elected committee of the members. We are very fortunate to be given generous financial support by NatWest Bank. We also receive valuable sponsorship from St John's Innovation Centre, The Welding Institute and Webtec Products Ltd.

Membership runs for the calendar year and current membership rates can be found on our website. Membership can be 'individual' or, for a slightly higher amount, 'corporate', which allows up to three people from the relevant organisation to attend. Members also have the opportunity to attend certain other Cambridge organisations' events either at reduced rates or for free.

Meetings are free for members. Non-members pay a meeting fee (current rates can be found on our website).

Membership Rates

You can join CETC either as an individual member or as a corporate member:

Single Membership: £35

This allows free attendance at any of the CETC seminars held throughout the year. Single membership entitles one named individual to attend each of the meetings. No alternative person can be substituted. Members may bring guests to seminars for a charge of £5 per meeting, paid in advance.

Corporate Membership: £70

Corporate membership allows attendance of up to three staff or guests to attend seminars free of charge throughout the year. Additional staff or guests are charged £5 per seminar, paid in advance.

Non-members £10 per meeting, paid in advance.
